

AGE-RELATED MACULAR DEGENERATION: PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE (Credits: 0.5 A IJCAHPO)

Michael Stewart, MD

This course will review age-related macular degeneration as well as past, present and future treatment options.

DIABETIC RETINOPATHY UPDATE (Credits: 0.5 A IJCAHPO)

Sunir Garg, MD, FACS

This course will cover the basic pathophysiology of diabetic eye disease. Dr. Garg will also emphasize newer treatments in the management of diabetic macular edema, non-proliferative diabetic retinopathy and proliferative diabetic retinopathy.

CODE V: PRINCIPLES OF SAFE ANTERIOR VITRECTOMY (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Lisa Arbisser, MD

This course will discuss important concepts in readiness to help the surgeon during complications of cataract surgery. Participants will have a better understanding of the signs of vitreous loss, the tools needed and the timing for safe and efficient anterior vitrectomy both by anterior incisions and via one port pars plana vitrectomy for the anterior segment surgeon. Readiness and an understanding of machine settings will be discussed.

CO-MANAGEMENT LIABILITY EXPOSURES AND RISK MANAGEMENT (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Hans Bruhn, MHS, and Michelle Pineda, MBA

This course will identify the medical malpractice liability risk exposures associated with patient co-management and how to mitigate those patient safety issues.

LEAN IMPLEMENTATION (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Carol Olvera, COT

This course will discuss a retina practice's experience with lean implementation. The course will discuss lean principles and how to apply them in a clinical setting, utilizing front line staff to assess inefficiencies and develop trials to improve clinic flow. Attendees will also learn how to track improvements using metrics and visibility across the clinical department.

ADVANCED ECHOGRAPHIC IMAGING THAT GUIDES SURGICAL OR CLINICAL INTERVENTION

(Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

This course will discuss the utilization of advanced ultrasound biomicroscopy (UBM) and B-scan imaging strategies and knowledge to aid in determination of clinical differentials and when surgical intervention is required. This course will focus on coupling intake clinical presentation with an optimized imaging approach to provide an advanced differential list and cautionary tales. Basic probe positions and instrumentation will not be reviewed.

HISTORY TAKING AND WORK UPS LIKE A TRUE DETECTIVE (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Upon completion of this course, participants should be able to gather a complete health history and perform a complete work up like a detective investigating a crime scene.

FLUORESCEIN IS NOT A VEGETABLE: COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS IN EYE CARE (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

This course will help hone your testing skills and improve patient communications by delving into the why of ophthalmic testing and bust some myths about eye care and function.

UNMASKING AND RECTIFYING ERRORS: BECOME INDISPENSABLE TO YOUR OPHTHALMOLOGIST

(Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Natalie Loyacano, COMT, ROUB, OCSR, OSA

Detecting, troubleshooting and correcting errors are critical skills that the ophthalmologist highly values in an ophthalmic technician. Most common errors are simple mistakes. This course will outline how to detect common errors made during the work up or intake of a patient, how to identify errors when performing diagnostic testing and how to correct them. This course will also address identifying and troubleshooting equipment errors.

EVALUATING PATIENTS FOR CATARACT SURGERY (Credits: 0.75 A IJCAHPO)

Darby Miller, MD

This course will discuss the signs and symptoms of cataracts, when surgery is indicated, and the risks, benefits and limitations of standard cataract surgery. It will also discuss the latest advancements in cataract surgery including, but not limited to, laser-assisted cataract surgery, intraoperative aberrometry and intraocular lenses.

TASS (Credits: 0.25 A IJCAHPO)

Cristos Ifantides, MD, MBA

This course will describe the cause of Toxic Anterior Segment Syndrome (TASS), symptoms, treatment and how this syndrome can be avoided. Proper cleaning and disinfection of ophthalmic surgical instruments will be discussed.

OPHTHALMIC INFECTIOUS DISEASES (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Charles Slonim, MD

This course will feature a slide presentation of various external (e.g., eyelids, lacrimal and orbital) and internal (e.g., conjunctiva, cornea and retina) infectious diseases with an emphasis on both the diagnosis and treatment of each condition.

WHAT IS THIS? OCULAR FINDINGS IN SYSTEMIC DISEASE (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Michael Stewart, MD

This course discusses the relationship between the eye and important systemic diseases. Eyes have often been called the "window" to the rest of the body, a tribute to the many systemic diseases whose ocular findings can lead to accurate diagnoses. This course discusses the ocular findings and their frequent association with systemic diseases.

UPDATE ON MODERN CORNEAL PROCEDURES: DMEK, DSEK, DALK, PKP (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Francis Mah, MD

This course will briefly review the history and indication for the various corneal procedures, surgical techniques and post-op management.

GRAND ROUNDS: PEDIATRICS AND STRABISMUS (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Brain Forbes, MD, PhD

This course will be driven by interesting and unique pediatric ophthalmology and strabismus cases, presented in an open forum format. Both strabismus cases as well as non-strabismus cases centered on pediatric ophthalmology will be presented. The goal will be to enable the participant to become more comfortable with unique pediatric ophthalmology cases and develop a sound method by which to approach such cases.

FLUORESCEIN ANGIOGRAPHY (Credits: 1.0 A IJCAHPO)

Craig Simms, BSc, COMT, ROUB, CDOS

This course will provide an overview of the basics of fluorescein angiography starting with luminescence and fluorescence and how it can be used in the eye. The process of fluorescein angiography will be covered including the dosage, injection, possible adverse reactions from the injection sequencing and completion of photography. The course will finish with the phases of the angiogram and descriptive terminology used to describe fluorescein angiography photographs.
