

8:50 - 9:40 a.m. **HYDROXYCHLOROQUINE (PLAQUENIL) TOXICITY •** William Ehlers, MD

This course will discuss hydroxychloroquine (Plaquenil) use and the ocular manifestations of Plaquenil Toxicity. Discussions will include the symptoms and risk factors for ocular toxicity, the role of the technician in obtaining a detailed history, and the importance of various tests for toxicity.

9:55 - 10:45 a.m. IMPROVING PATIENT COMPLIANCE • Bobbi Ballenberg, COMT, OSC

This course will provide suggestions for improving patient compliance with their prescribed treatment regimens. The focus will be on the important role the technician plays in this process as someone who can empathize with, educate, and empower the patient and/or their caretaker. Common obstacles that patients face and excuses that patients give for non-compliance, along with possible solutions, will be discussed.

In this course, the instructor will share his 15 years of experience as an orthoptist in pediatric ophthalmology and neuro-ophthalmology clinics, examining nystagmus patients of all ages, to show you how to classify the various types of nystagmus into a small number of easy-to-remember categories

so as to make use of this very important clinical sign.

This course is intended to give the ophthalmic professional tools to determine the appropriate scheduling of the ophthalmic patient. Case studies will be used as an interactive tool to discuss scheduling mock patients in the

busy clinic schedule.
