

8:00 - 9:00 a.m. BASIC OPHTHALMIC SURGICAL ASSISTING • John Nguyen, MD

This course will prepare ophthalmic technicians to aid in the preparation of patients for surgery, to gain competency with aseptic techniques, to assist with ophthalmic anesthesia and common ophthalmic surgical procedures, and to recognize surgical complications.

9:00 - 10:00 a.m. DIABETIC RETINOPATHY: THE DISEASE, IMAGING TECHNIQUES, AND THERAPEUTIC OPTIONS

Worldwide, over 415 million people have diabetes mellitus, of which upwards of one-third have diabetic retinopathy. Diabetic retinopathy is the leading cause of new blindness for those ages 25-74. This course will discuss the etiology and ophthalmologic findings of the disease, as well as new/more effective diagnostic techniques and treatment entities.

10:15 - 11:15 a.m. **EVALUATING THE PATIENT WITH STRABISMUS** • Geoffrey Bradford, MS, MD

Best practices for performing intravitreal injections based on current literature will be discussed in this course. Evidence based methods of preparation of the ocular surface, the prevention of infection, as well as the administration of longer acting implants will also be discussed.

11:15 a.m. - 12:15 p.m. OPPORTUNITIES IN INTERNATIONAL OPHTHALMOLOGY • VK Raju, MD, FRCS, FACS

This course will discuss opportunities in international ophthalmology, especially in regards to preventable childhood blindness. Dr. Raju will also review how to maximize the use of limited resources, summarize research on vitamin A deficiency in developing countries, as well as share his experiences teaching and learning from local doctors and technicians.

12:15 - 1:15 p.m. **DINING IN THE DARK LUNCHEON**

The luncheon today will be a unique sensory-awareness experience that will give you a first-hand glimpse into the lives of those who are blind or have low vision. During lunch, eye masks will be provided to wear while eating. The purpose of the luncheon is to help make us more aware of the difficulties millions of people deal with each day and what role we play in assisting patients with low vision. Experiences and observations will be shared and discussed throughout the luncheon.

1:15 - 2:15 p.m. **HERPETIC EYE DISEASE •** Gautam Mishra, MD

An overview of herpetic eye problems will be presented in this course, with a focus on Herpes Simplex and Herpes Zoster. The natural history and treatment options will be discussed.

2:15 - 3:15 p.m. **LOWER EYELID MALPOSITION •** John Nguyen, MD

This course reviews the indications for repair of lower eyelid malpositions, and reviews details of the surgical techniques typically employed.

3:15 - 4:15 p.m. CREATING TRUST WITH THE VISUALLY IMPAIRED PATIENT • Charlene Sue Campbell, COMT, OSC

This course will introduce attendees to the difficulties incurred by visually impaired patients, not only in the exam, but also in life. Ways to gain patient trust during the exams will also be discussed.
