8:00-8:50 a.m.	<b>MULTIPLE MODALITIES CASE PRESENTATION</b> • Craig Simms, BSc, COMT, CDOS, ROUB This course will present cases where the patient underwent multiple testing modalities. The focus will be on how the different modalities correlate and help the ophthalmologist come to a conclusion. Cases presented will include ultrasound imaging, photography, visual field testing, and electrophysiology.	
8:50-9:40 a.m.	<b>GLAUCOMA: THE CLINICAL APPROACH</b> • Robin Cottle, MD, FRCS Glaucoma is well known as the second most common cause of blindness in America. This course will highlight the anatomical and pathophysiological changes of the glaucomatous eye with corresponding classifications, preventions, and treatment options. The objective of this course is to aid the technician's recognition of glaucomatous eye changes and assist in diagnostic testing determination.

9:55-10:45 a.m.	<b>LOTIONS, POTIONS, TOXINS, AND FILLERS: NONSURGICAL REJUVENATION</b> Femida Kherani, MD, FRCSC, DABO This course will introduce a variety of non-surgical rejuvenation methods for the face and periocular region. Focus will be on topical treatments, botulinum toxins, and dermal fillers that can be used to shape the periocular region and provide patients with a more youthful look. Each of these treatments can be used alone or, ideally, in combination for a more optimal outcome.

12:40-1:30 p.m.	<b>CATARACT SURGERY</b> • Christopher Pollock, MD, MSc, FRCSC Informed consent for cataract surgery in British Columbia, steps of cataract surgery, and common and serious complications will be discussed in this course. Surgical videos will be shown.	
1:30-2:20 p.m.	<b>PRIMARY AHMED VALVE IMPLANTATION: A SURGICAL OPTION FOR PEDIATRIC GLAUCOMA</b> William F. Astle, MD, FRCSC, Dipl. ABO Ahmed valve surgery as a primary procedure is a viable alternative to more standard glaucoma operations for treatment of congenital and pediatric glaucoma. It represents a valuable tool in quickly regaining IOP control in these complex pediatric cases, without the need for multiple surgeries and prolonged exposure to loss of vision from poorer long-term IOP control.

2:35-3:25 p.m.	<b>OVERVIEW OF VITREORETINAL SURGERY</b> • Steve Levasseur, BSc, MD, FRCSC One of the breakthroughs in ophthalmic medicine has been the restoration of eyesight to patients diagnosed with retinal eye diseases. Through lecture on the basic principles of retinal surgery and the use of video presentations, this course will present various retinal diseases and applicable surgical and laser treatments of those conditions. The technician's understanding of vitreoretinal surgery can be a useful reinforcement in patient counseling to help understand expectations.	
3:25-4:15 p.m.	<b>DON'T EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED</b> • Craig Simms, BSc, COMT, CDOS, ROUB Mistakes happen. Nobody means to make a mistake. However, in an eye clinic there are things we as AOP can do to help reduce the number of mistakes that happen. This course covers real-life mistakes that have happened in an eye clinic and ways to help minimize their effect.
