9:55-10:45 a.m.	NIX THE NEEDLE: INTRODUCTION TO OCTA Denice Barsness, COMT, ROUB, CDOS, CRA It has been 50 years since sodium fluorescein angiography was developed as a clinical procedure. Fluorescein angiography was the mainstay of retinal diagnostic imaging modalities for decades until the advent of OCT in the mid 1990's. With the emergence of OCTA we may well have a new "king of the hill" for retinal and optic nerve imaging. This course will provide an overview of OCTA technology. Common applications for OCTA will be discussed using case studies. Artifacts and limitations of OCTA will be reviewed and case studies comparing IV sodium fluorescein angiography and OCTA will be utilized.

The course will also cover the possible complications (including microbial keratitis) and the approaches the FDA is taking to reduce the incidence of complications.
