

IJCAHPO Updates

IJCAHPO is Streamlining CE Credit Requirements

IJCAHPO is making the recertification process easier for you. Instead of needing to keep track of two types of credits, Group A and Group B, IJCAHPO will only require Group A credits starting August 1, 2020. Group B credits earned on or before July 31, 2020 will still be accepted with your next certification/recertification application.

CPR certification and authorship of papers and posters will be accepted on topics as approved Group A credit. AMA and CMA Category 1 courses for CME will no longer be accepted.

IJCAHPO Council organizations that provide Certification, Recertification, and CE Credits for its independent certifications shall be recognized for CE credit equivalency for IJCAHPO's recertification requirements. Currently, these organizations include the Ophthalmic Photographers' Society (OPS) and the American Orthoptic Council (AOC).

IJCAHPO certificants who are dual certified with IJCAHPO certification and one or more of IJCAHPO's Council organizations will be eligible to submit 1/3 of their recertification credits that come from these Council organizations. The CE course content must meet IJCAHPO's examination content areas or CE Credit content categories.

IJCAHPO certificants may not submit credits from these organizations if they do not hold their certification. Verification of OPS or AOC certification will be required.

For example:

Credential	Total Number of Credits Required	Minimum Number of Group A Credits Required	Maximum Number of approved OPS and AOC Credits Permitted with Dual Certification
COA	18	12	6
COT	27	18	9
COMT	36	24	12

Group B credit will no longer be accepted for applications for CEC programs that are taking place on or after August 1, 2020.

Did You Know?

- You can now save time and money by recertifying online! <u>Start your online</u> recertification application.
- You can recertify by completing the multiple-choice examination at your certification level instead of completing continuing education credits. Your certification must be not be in a revoked status. The examination application with the examination fee needs to be submitted and after you pass the examination, you will receive a new 36-month certification cycle.
- If you complete courses at <u>www.EyeCareCE.org</u>, the CE credits will automatically go on your IJCAHPO transcript. Then when you recertify, just print a copy of your transcript and attach it to your recertification application.
- You may print a verification of your certification at any time at <u>www.jcahpo.org</u>. Just click on Certification Verification under Certification and enter your IJCAHPO ID number.




